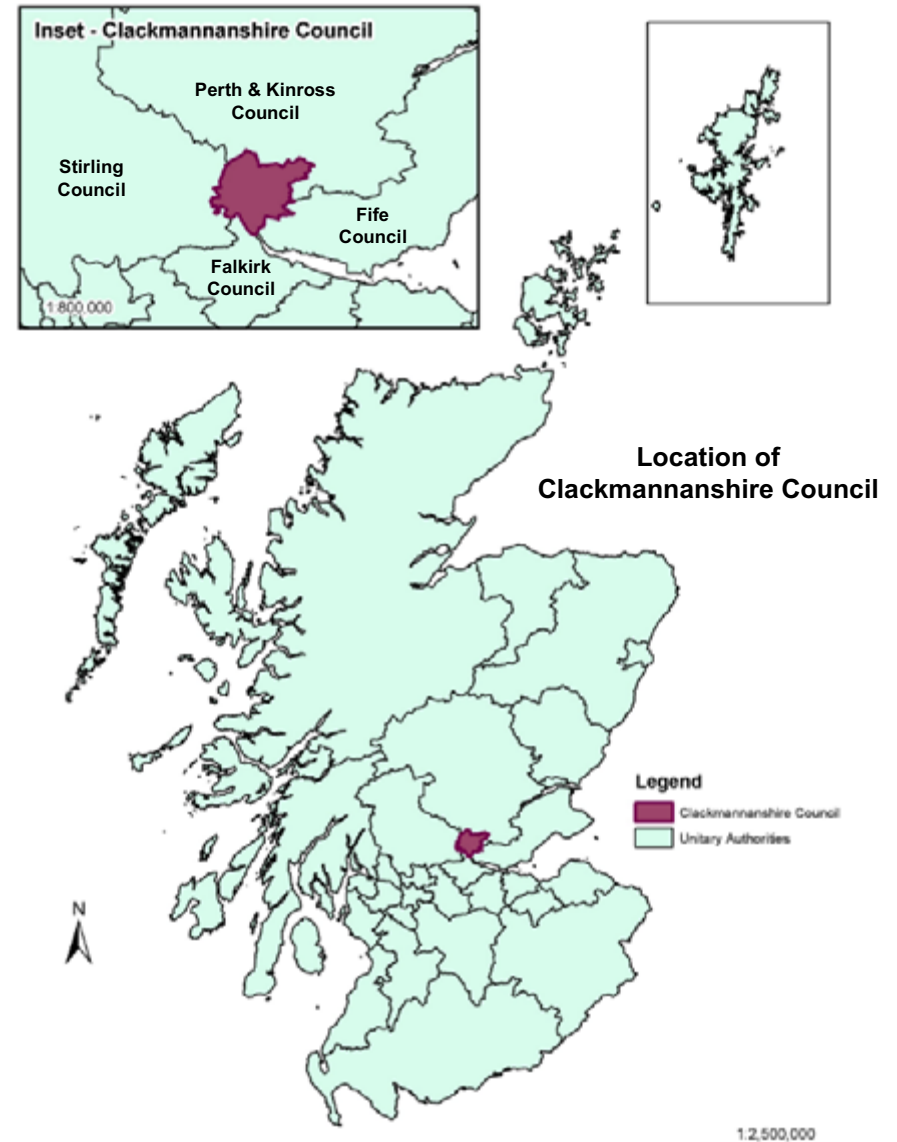

*Key Statistics for Council areas and Health Board areas, Scotland.*

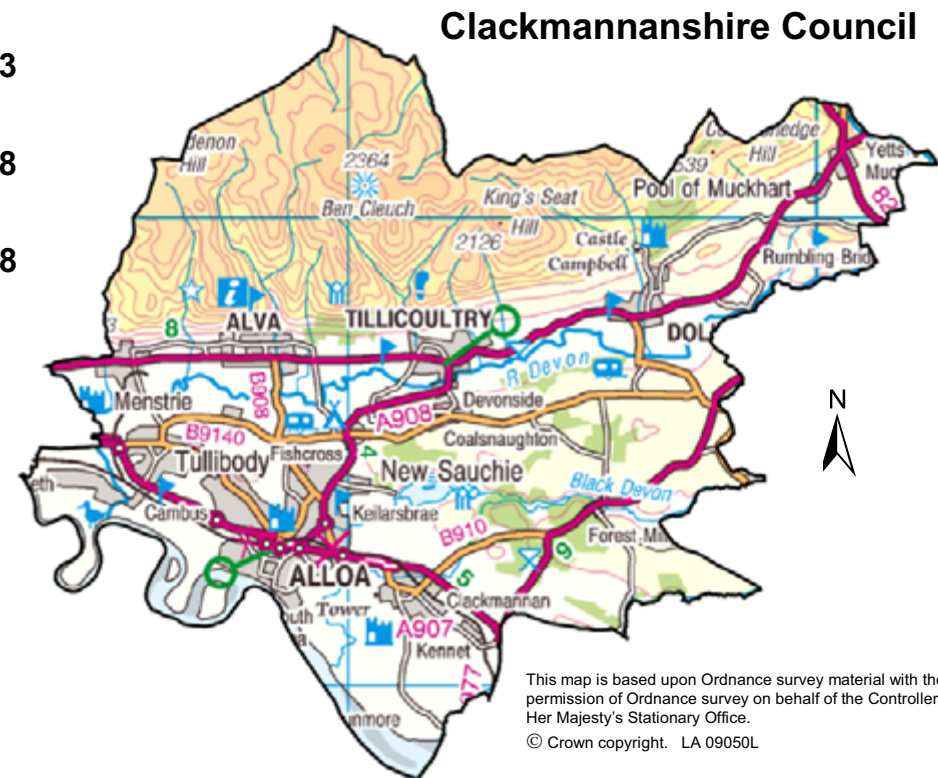

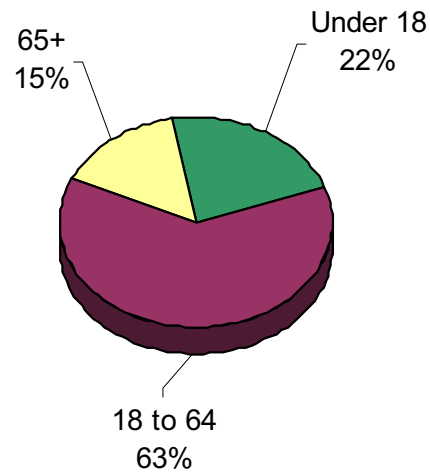

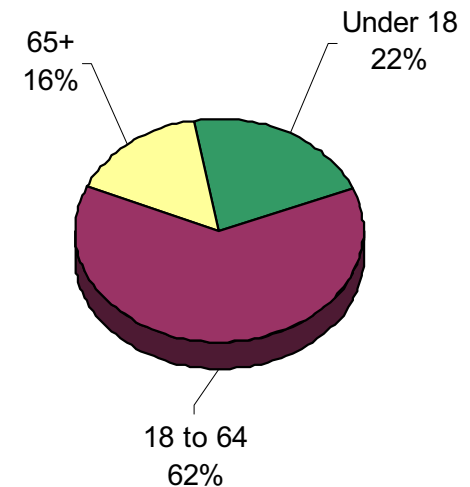
**% of People in Clackmannanshire Aged:**

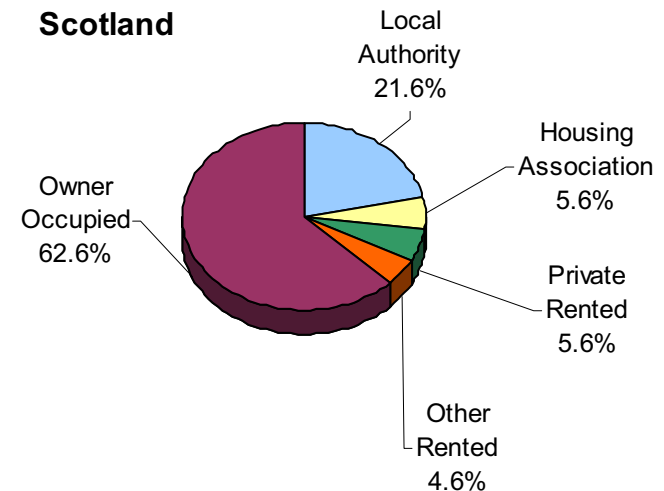

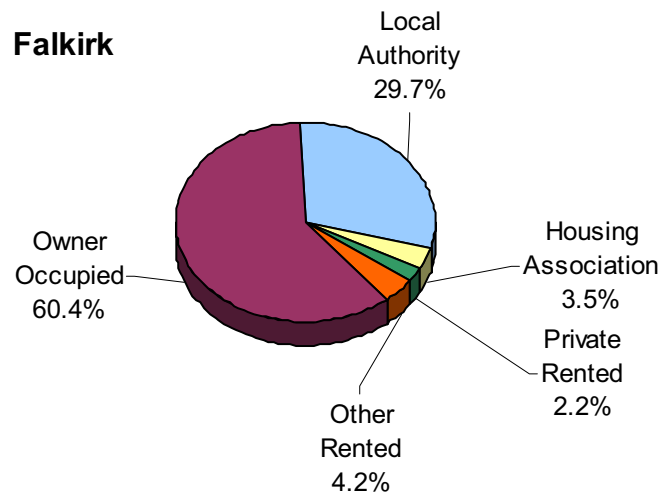

**House Type (Percentage of Household Spaces)**



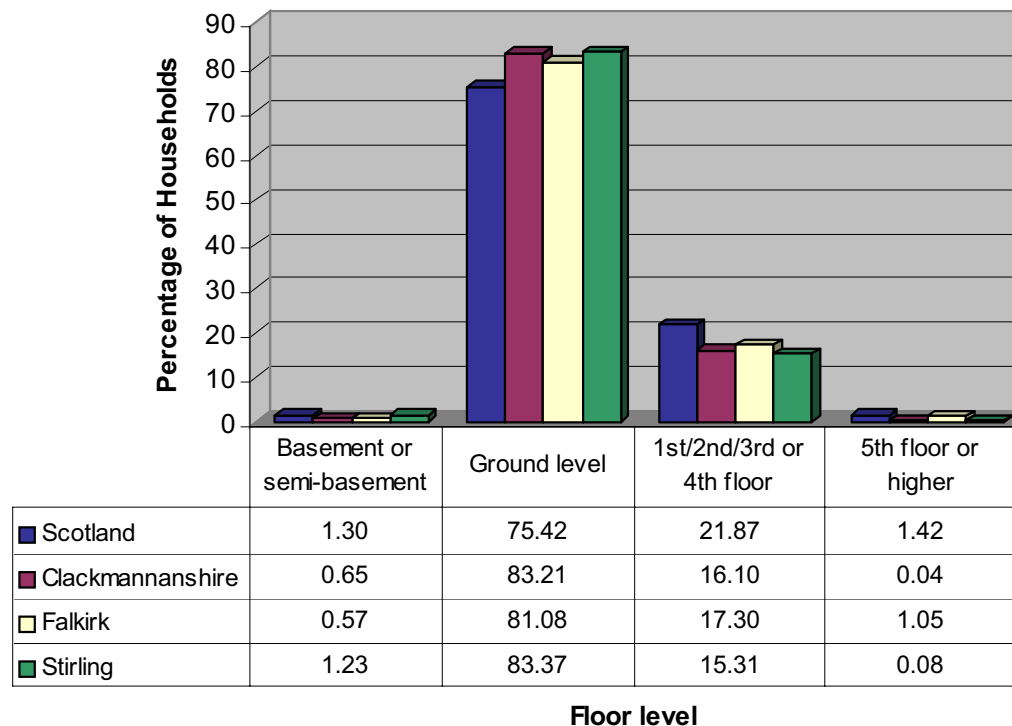

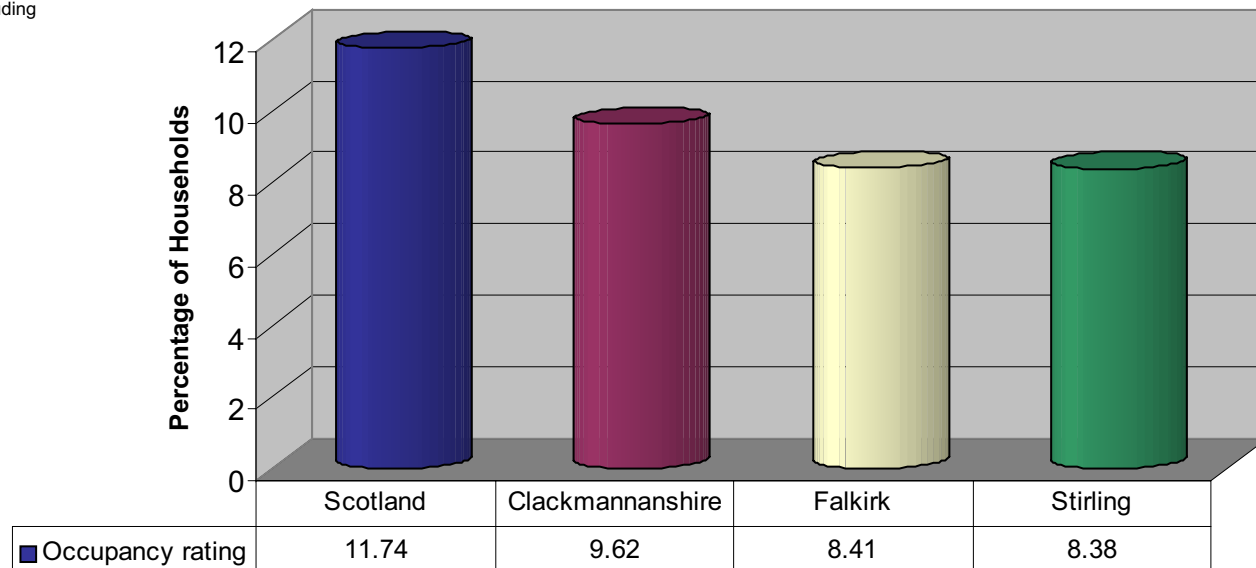

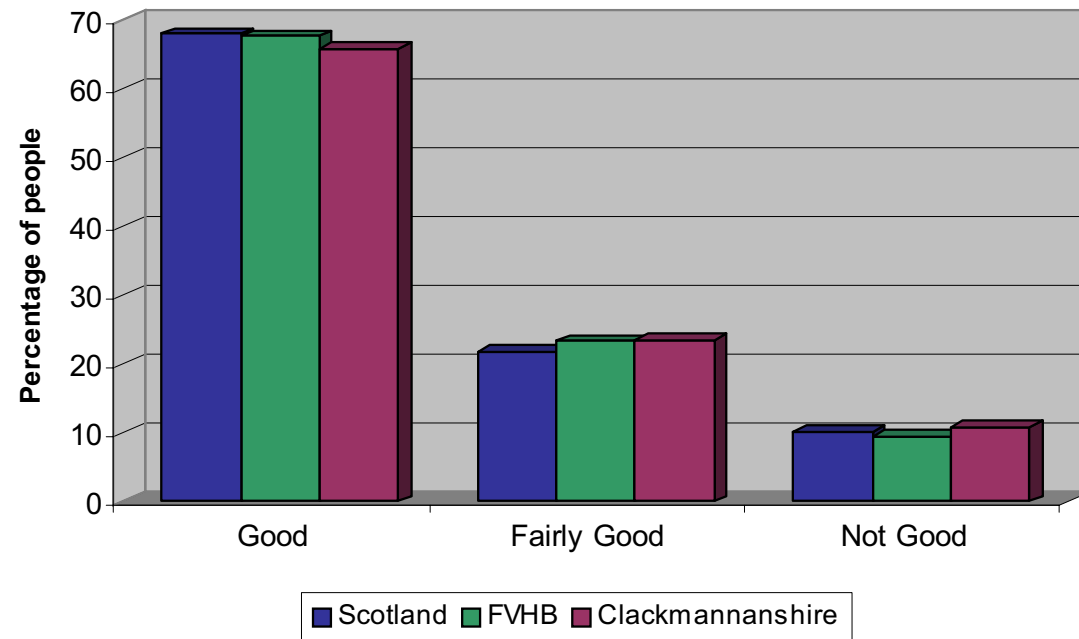

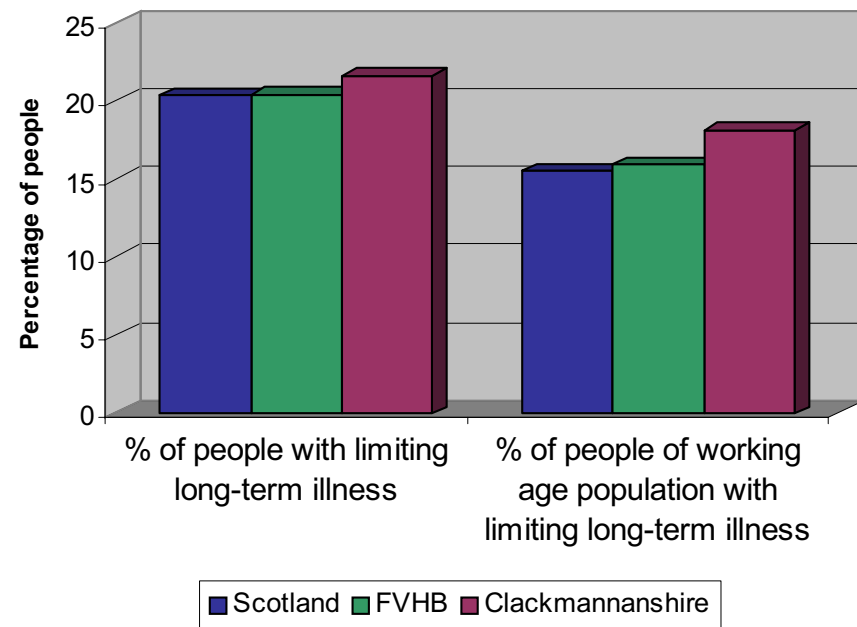

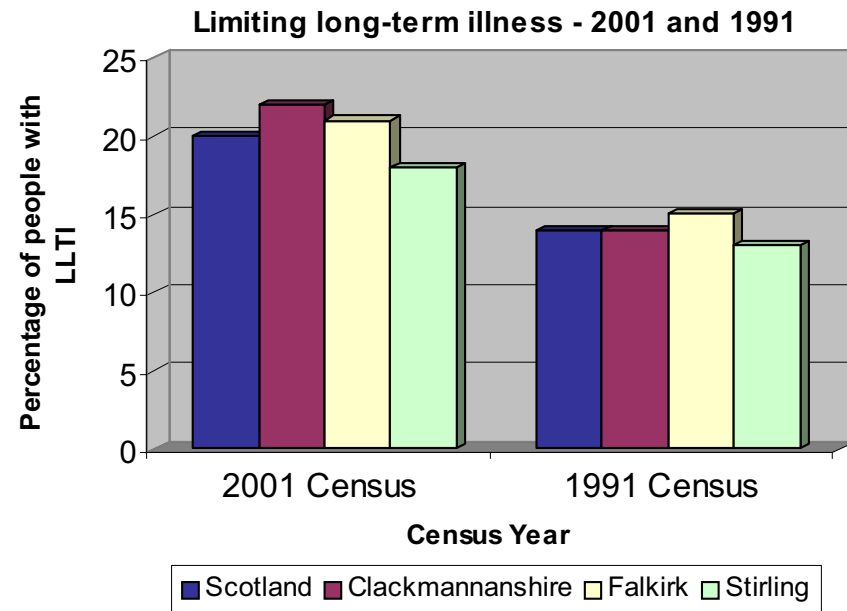

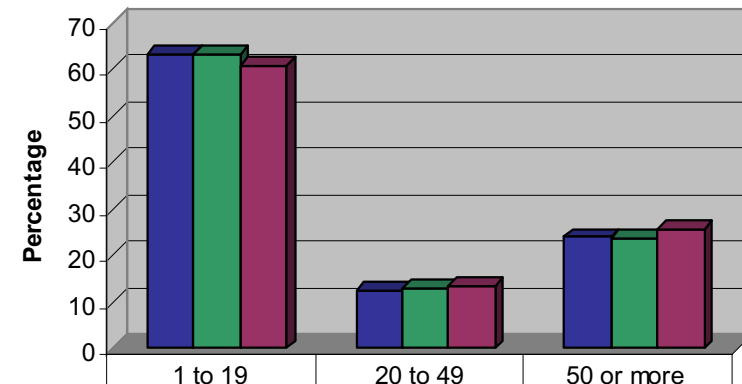

**Economic Activity (Aged 16 - 74)**



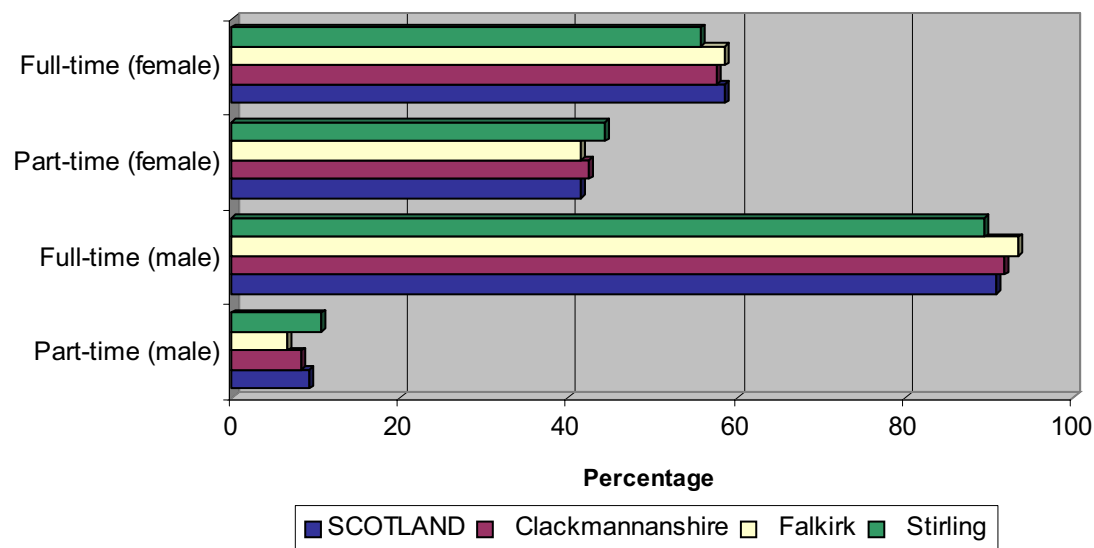

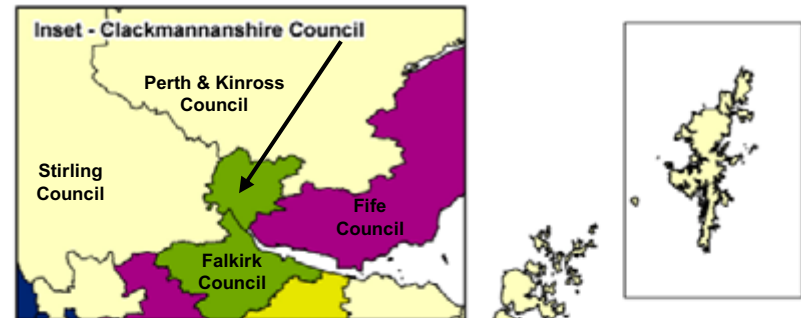
### Percentage of Males/Females Working Full-time or Part-time



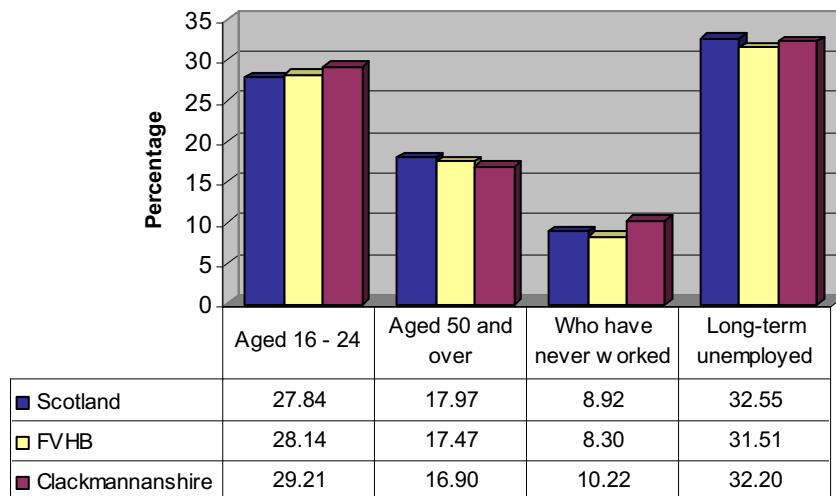

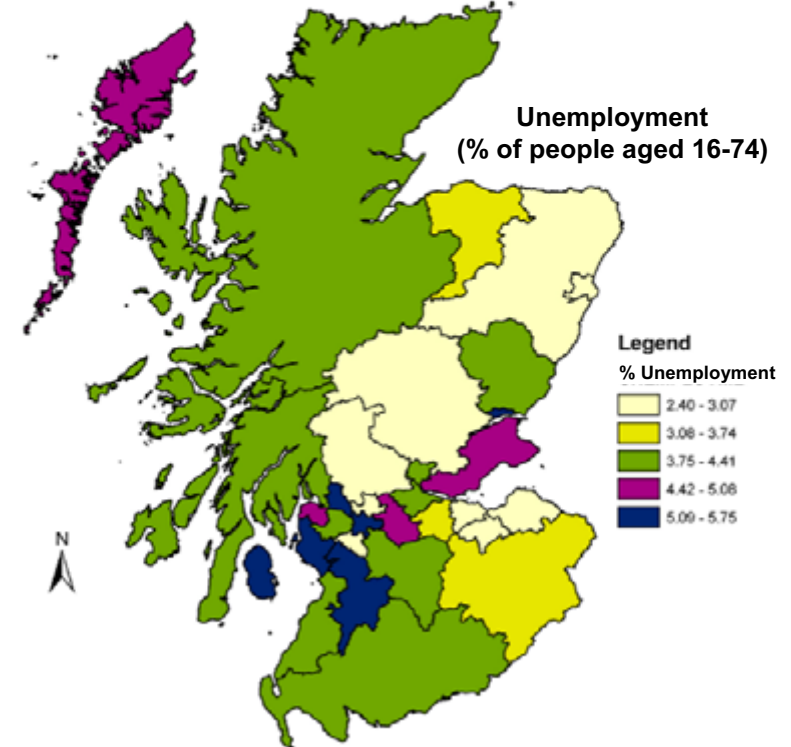

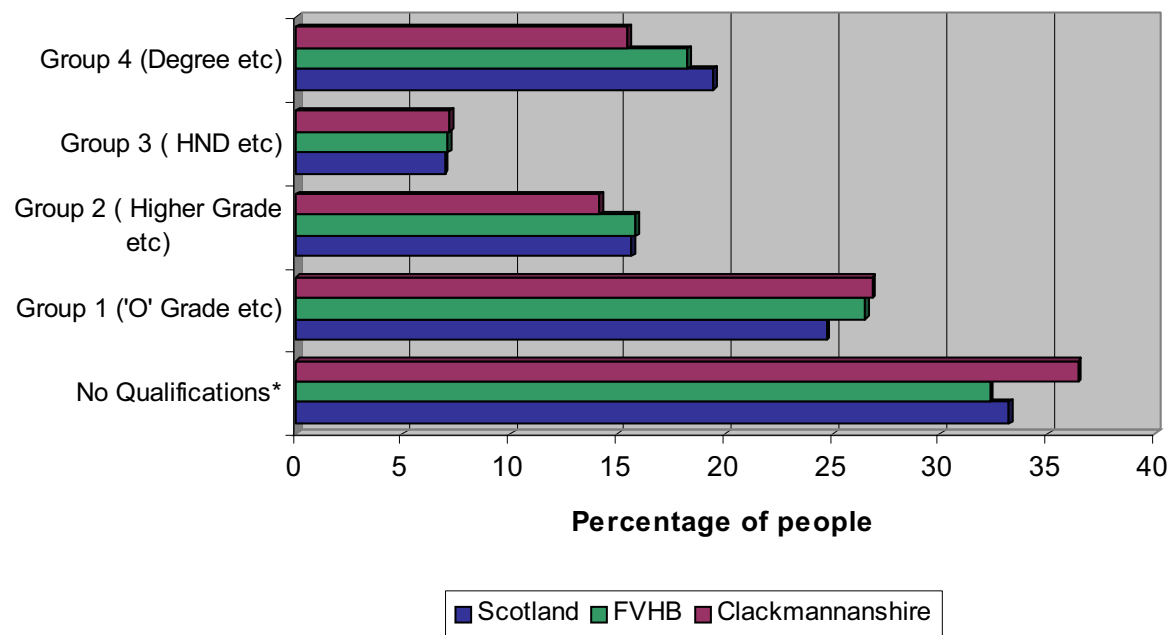

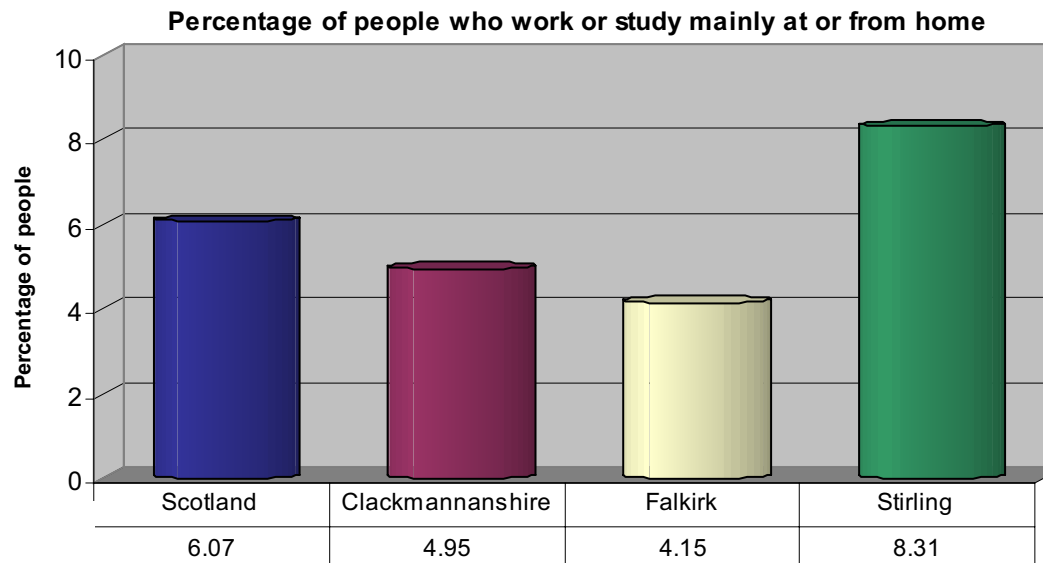

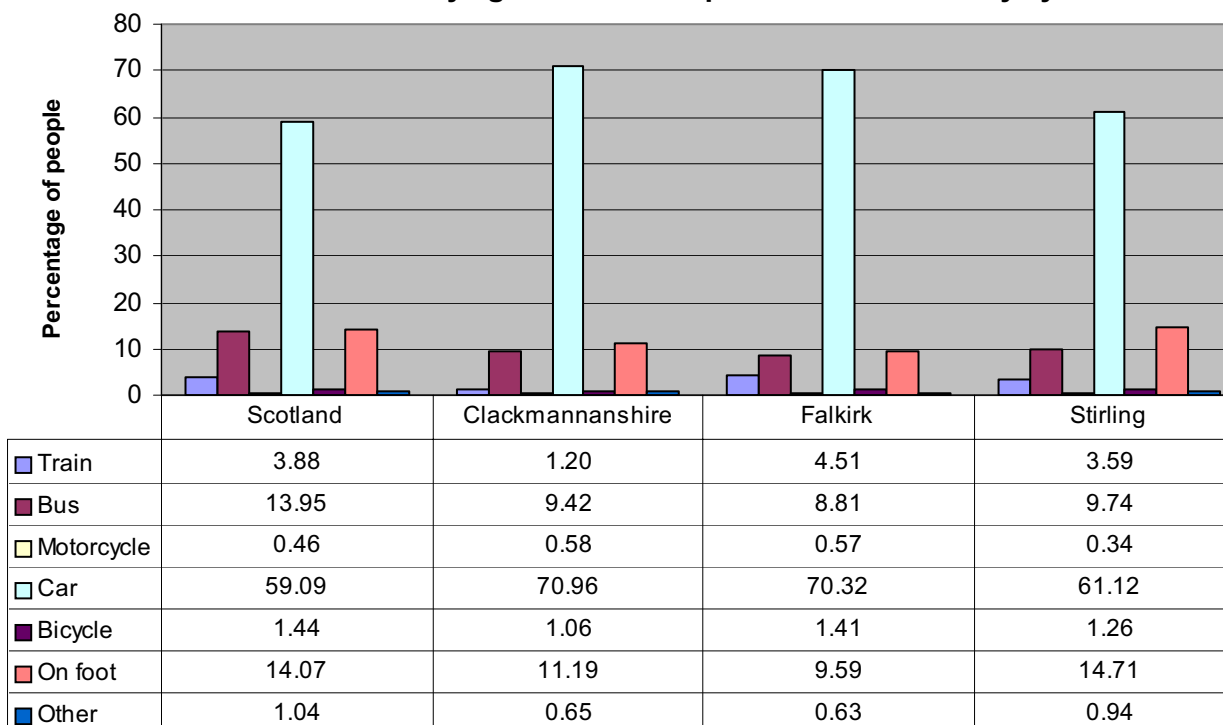

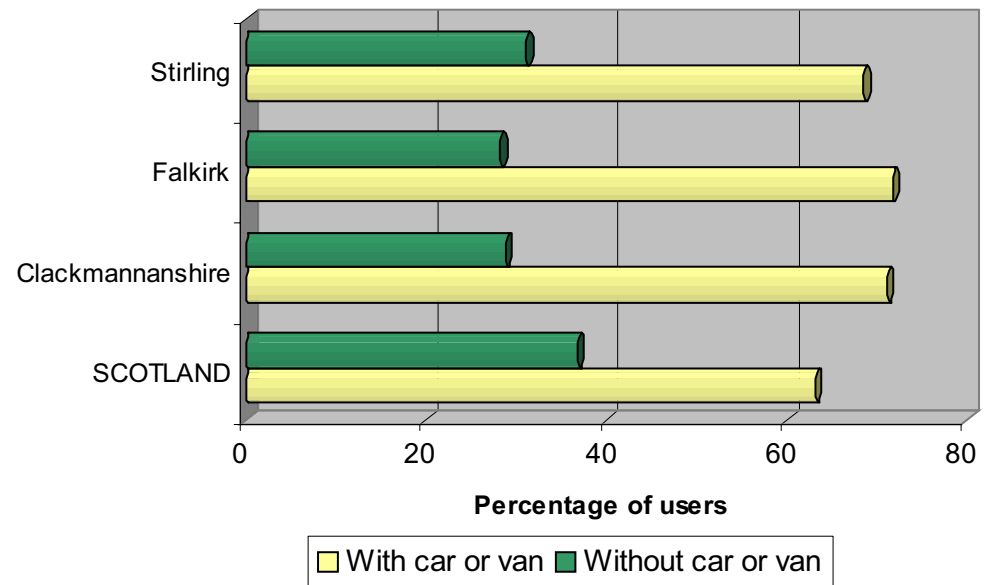
