

Ideas to Improve your Neighbourhood - Community Safety Cash Fund.

Clackmannanshire's Community Safety Partnership are looking for community groups and individuals with ideas for projects to apply for grants up to **£500**.

Projects should target at least one of the following: reducing crime, reducing anti-social behaviour, reducing the fear of crime or improving and general safety of our communities.

Here are some examples of the types of projects that we would like to fund in Clackmannanshire:

- Communities and generations coming together to devise and implement safety initiatives or programmes.
- Environmental improvement schemes which tackle graffiti, litter and vandalism and generally promote a safer community.
- Educational programmes in relation to alcohol and unsafe or hazardous drinking.
- Schemes that will positively raise awareness of community safety issues.
- Initiatives to combat fear of crime.
- Community celebrations with a strong community safety element.

What we will Not Fund

- Projects which are solely the remit of statutory agencies.
- Projects which do not clearly address community safety issues.
- Staff costs, travel and expenses.
- Prizes.
- Activities or projects that happen or start before we confirm our grant.
- Projects that will happen after March 2012.

Who can Apply

- Any community group in Clackmannanshire; or any individual in Clackmannanshire who is supported by a Group or agency.

We would love to hear your ideas for projects in Clackmannanshire, so please get in touch if you are unsure about eligibility or criteria for funding.

How we will Assess Applications

Each Application for funding will be assessed on its individual merit by the Community Safety Partnership who will take into consideration:

- If the application meets the criteria for funding, and has a clear community safety element.
- The level of community support and involvement.
- Value for money.
- The amount of funds available to the partnership .
